STORM WATER WATCHERS

SEEK and FIND why my home is polluted

WETLANDS have soils and plants that act like SPONGES when it rains. Wetlands are the home for many animals such as fish, birds, and crabs. Hard surfaces like rooftops and roads are just the opposite. They are IMPERVIOUS. If a surface is impervious, it means that STORM WATER cannot SOAK through it. When rain falls on impervious surfaces, it becomes RUNOFF. Runoff goes into storm drains and CREEKS. Runoff picks up LITTER and POLLUTION from impervious surfaces. OIL and chemicals are sometimes dumped directly into a STORM DRAIN. Runoff does not go to the sewer plant. It is UNTREATED. In Wilmington, runoff goes to the CAPE FEAR River or the Intracoastal Waterway. Dirty runoff can harm or kill wildlife and FISH. We must try to keep storm water runoff CLEAN. Next time it rains, be a *Storm Water Watcher* by keeping litter and pollution out of the way. Only RAIN should go into storm drains!
