

WHAT HAPPENS TO THE HHW MATERIALS AFTER COLLECTION?

All materials are recycled, repurposed, neutralized, used for alternative power generation, or disposed of in accordance with state and federal law. Here are some examples:

- Repurposed
 - Latex paint is used to cover the landfill working area daily to prevent the spread of debris
- Recycled
 - Motor oil and cooking oil can be cleaned and reused
 - Batteries are stripped to their metal components and recycled
- Neutralized
 - Acids and caustics are neutralized and solidified
- Alternative power generation
 - Flammable liquids and solids can be incinerated to generate electricity

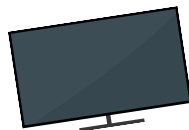

- Acids
- Aerosols
- Antifreeze
- Ballasts
- Batteries
 - Alkaline
 - Zinc-carbon
 - Zinc-air
 - Lithium
 - Sealed lead-acid
 - Any rechargeable battery
- Caustics
- CD's, DVD's, VHS
- Cell phones
- Compact Fluorescent Lamps, Tubes, and Bulbs
- Cooking Oil
- Electronics-items with electrical cords or batteries
- Food Waste
- Holiday Lights
- Hoverboards
- Fertilizers-solid or liquid

- Fuels
- Gel Fuels

MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

- Asbestos-containing materials
- Dismantled TV's or computer monitors
- Explosives and Ammunition
- Prescription Medications
 - Consult with NHC Public Health for disposal locations
- Regulated medical waste
- White goods and appliances such as refrigerators, washing machines, freezers, etc
 - These can be taken to the NHC landfill for recycling
- Materials from outside of New Hanover County
