

What are the biggest issues?

- More sidewalks and bike lanes
- Bike and pedestrian loop
- Lower speed limit on Wrightsville Avenue
- Crosswalks at Wrightsville Avenue/Airlie Road
- Parking area for access to Cross City Trail
- Safer bike and pedestrian access to shopping and recreation
- Access to Bradley Creek
- Safer bridge crossing over Bradley Creek

What is your big idea?


- More sidewalks and bike lanes




### Current Population




### Population Change




### Planning Area Location




### Age Composition





### Housing Occupancy and Values




### Land Use Distribution




